Applying for an Australia Awards scholarship

Australia Awards scholarships in Myanmar

Australia's international development assistance in Myanmar helps promote prosperity, reduce poverty, and enhance political stability.

Australia Awards are prestigious international awards offered by the Australian Government to the next generation of global leaders for development. Through study and research, recipients develop the skills and knowledge to drive change and help build enduring people-to-people links with Australia.

Applicants are assessed on their professional and personal qualities, academic competence and, most importantly, their potential to impact on development challenges in Myanmar.

Applications are strongly encouraged from women, people with disability and other marginalised groups.

Priority fields of study

The priority areas of study for Myanmar are:

- Education (for e.g. education policy, quality assurance and statistics, student learning assessment, education economics, technical and vocational education and training (TVET), curriculum studies)
- Human resource development (for e.g. public administration, human resource management, labour market economics, information management)
- Trade and private sector development (for e.g. economics, financial analysis, international business, infrastructure, trade policy, public policy, tax, energy engineering, mining)
- Gender equality, Social inclusion and human rights (for e.g. gender, disability, intersectionality, development, international human rights law, peace/conflict, humanitarian leadership)
- Rule of Law and Governance (for e.g. law, political science, human rights, transnational crime)
- Environment and natural resources (for e.g. natural resource management, water resources, climate

- change, disaster risk management, environment, conservation)
- Public Health (for e.g. epidemiology, public health, health security, health economics, disease control, bio security)

Level of study

Australia Awards scholarships provide citizens of Myanmar with the opportunity to obtain a qualification at an Australian tertiary institution.

Awards will be offered for commencement in 2023 within the following allocations:

 In Myanmar, Australia Award Scholarships are available for <u>Masters level study</u> only.

Australia Awards benefits

Australia Awards scholarships are offered for the minimum period necessary for the individual to complete the academic program specified by the Australian education institution, including any preparatory training.

Scholarship recipients will receive the following:

- return air travel
- · a one-off establishment allowance on arrival
- full tuition fees
- · contribution to living expenses
- introductory academic program
- overseas student health cover for the duration of the scholarship
- supplementary academic support
- fieldwork allowance for research students and masters by coursework which has a compulsory fieldwork component.

Eligibility criteria

Australia Awards applicants must meet all eligibility requirements detailed in the Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook, available at: dfat.gov.au/about-us/publications/Pages/australia-awards-scholarships-policy-handbook.aspx

As per the Handbook, current serving military personnel are not eligible to apply for Australia Awards.

English language requirements

An IELTS or TOEFL score is not required at the time of application. Applicants, who do have an IELTS or TOEFL score if shortlisted for the interview, are required to sit for an IELTS test prior to the interview.

Applicants must have achieved an IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5 or higher (with no individual band score of less than 6.0) or an equivalent TOEFL or PTE score prior to mobilisation.

DFAT will offer support for English language training to applicants offered a provisional award. Those eligible to receive the support will be notified after the selection interview.

The offer of an Australia Award is conditional upon IELTS requirements being satisfied. If an applicant fails to achieve the required IELTS within the designated time period the applicant's Australia Awards Scholarship offer may be withdrawn.

Country-specific conditions

In addition to the eligibility requirements, candidates from Myanmar must also meet the following conditions:

- be a Myanmar citizen currently residing in Myanmar
- · completed Bachelor's degree
- be at least 25 years old at 30 April 2022
- · have at least two (2) years of work experience

Applicants are encouraged to demonstrate how their chosen course of study builds on their work experience.

Any application which shows evidence of plagiarism (copying from other applicants) will be deemed ineligible. This constitutes fraud which is contrary to Australian values and will not be tolerated.

Application dates

For study commencing in Australia in 2023:

Opening date: 1 February 2022

Closing date: (11.59PM AEST) 29 April 2022

Applications and/or supporting documents received after the closing date will not be considered.

The application process

Online applications

All applications must be lodged online through https://oasis.dfat.gov.au

We strongly encourage applicants to apply online and complete their application as early as possible.

Please note the online application facility (OASIS) experiences peak usage in the days leading up to the closing date and applicants may experience delays.

Document certification can be completed by any public notary.

The selection process

- Applications will be shortlisted after eligibility checking.
- Only shortlisted candidates will be contacted
- The selection process includes an interview. Applicants will be assessed against the following criteria:
 - academic competence
 - potential outcome, specifically the contribution to development outcomes in Myanmar
 - professional and personal leadership attributes including relevant work experience.
- Successful candidates will be notified in late 2022.
 Applicants will be informed of a revised timeline should the selection processes be impacted by the global COVID-19 pandemic or international travel and border restrictions.
- Awardee travel will be subject to meeting the requirements imposed by the Australian Government, as determined by the Department of Education, Skills and Employment, and must meet the requirements imposed by State and Territory governments.

Outcomes

Please note that the offer of an Australia Awards Scholarships is provisional until the following requirements are met:

- applicant meets the minimum Australia Awards scholarships English proficiency requirements and the minimum IELTS requirements of their selected institution / course,
- applicant is admitted to an eligible course at an Australian university, and
- applicant is issue with the relevant visa by the Australia Department of Home Affairs.

Preparatory training

Successful applicants will be required to attend:

- · course counselling
- pre-departure briefing
- university's Introductory Academic Program
- other required preparatory study on arrival in Australia.
